Historical Note

The Dallas Woman's Forum was founded in 1906. The first president was a woman named E.P. Turner, who was the State President of the Texas Federation. She felt that a city like Dallas with a population of 100,000+ should have a departmental club, therefore, this name was chosen. Nine departments were established: Art, Bible and Sacred History, Congress of Mothers, Current Events, Household Economics and Pure Food, Music, Civics and Philanthropy, Philosophy and Science, and Literature. President Turner envisioned that Dallas have a club/forum similar to New York and Chicago.

After the San Francisco earthquake, the Forum began their first philanthropic work. As the U.S. entered World War I, the Forum involved itself in many war efforts: they sold liberty bonds, learned about war gardens, and also began working with the Red Cross. By the mid 1920s, with its membership at 700, the Forum became the largest departmental club in the Southwest. The Alexander Mansion was purchased in 1932 as the permanent meeting place.

On May 6th, 2006 the Forum held a celebration in commemoration of the 100th anniversary of their founding, as well as the 100th anniversary of the Mansion. As the years passed, the Forum continued their work for their many causes, often during war times.

The collection contains attendance lists, membership applications, membership dues, programs, treasurer reports, yearbooks, ledgers, and museum artifacts.
