Biographical Sketch:

John Leslie Patton, Jr. was born on May 19, 1905 in Dallas Texas to John Leslie Patton, Sr. and Ella Thomas Patton. He died on July 19, 1971 in Dallas. Mr. Patton began his educational career in 1926 as an elementary teacher. In 1928 he transferred to Booker T Washington High School where he taught History. In 1939, J L Patton, Jr became principal of Booker T Washington and served as principal until 1969. He also served as the Assistant Director of the Dallas Public Evening Schools and Director of the Adult Civil Defense Program. While principal of Booker T Washington, he implemented an African American curriculum for all students, which included the achievements of black historical figures. Around the same time, Mr. Patton authored *A Student's Outline Guide for the Study of Negro History*.

This book was revised by Patton and H.I. Holland in 1939. Mr. Patton also implemented course work for returning GI's after World War II and helped to create technical/vocational classes for night-school programs and work study programs. In 1969 he was appointed as Deputy Assistant Superintendent of Personnel and Community Relations becoming the first African American to serve in a top administrative position in the Dallas Independent School District. John L Patton was very active in the Dallas community and was a member of numerous clubs and organizations including the Knights of Pythias, Phi Delta Kappa, the Dallas Negro Chamber of Commerce, the local chapter of the NAACP to name but a few. He was a frequent speaker at public events such as college and high school commencements, civic engagements, and eulogies.
