The history museum tells stories about things that have already happened. We call this *the past*. The past teaches us important things about how we live today.

At the museum I will:

Use walking feet.

There are people who work for the museum who can help me. They wear white shirts and khaki pants, and work at the front desk.

The museum has bathrooms on the basement level. I can take the steps or the elevator (Level B) to go down to the bathrooms.

The girl's bathroom is on the right side of the building, and the boy's bathroom is on the left side of the building.





At the history museum I can listen to a storytelling performance by “Cowboy Jack”, who tells a story of his life and adventures on the cattle trail. If there are parts of the story that are too loud, I can cover my ears.

The performance will be in the auditorium on the basement level.



I can visit the exhibit *Shared Border: An Exhibit of Tex-Mex Culture*.

This exhibit teaches me about the shared cultures of Texas and Mexico that have helped shape the day-to-day lives of our two countries and the world. I will learn about things such as food, music, and festivals.



I can also visit the exhibit *Women's Suffrage in Texas*. This exhibit teaches me about the struggle for women to receive the right to vote in Texas.
